The Texas Tenors bring their cowboy charm and breathtaking vocals to the Omaha Symphony

Program includes hits like “You’ve Lost That Lovin’ Feelin’,” “Amazing Grace,” “God Bless the USA,”

OMAHA, Neb., Jan. 10, 2018- It will be a night of country, classical, Broadway, and pop music, with a touch of cowboy charm, as The Texas Tenors take center stage with the Omaha Symphony in two performances Saturday, Jan. 20, 7:30 p.m., and Sunday, Jan. 21, 2 p.m., at the Holland Performing Arts Center.

Conducted by Music Director Thomas Wilkins, The Texas Tenors will create an unforgettable live show with staggering range, from Bruno Mars to *Les Misérables*. The concert program will include hits like “You’ve Lost That Lovin’ Feelin’,” “Desperado,” “Amazing Grace,” and “God Bless the USA,” as well as songs from their recent album “Rise,” and a medley of songs from *Les Misérables*.

Composed of John Hagen, Marcus Collins, and JC Fisher, The Texas Tenors have been on a whirlwind since their debut eight years ago on NBC’s *America’s Got Talent*. They have accumulated a long list of awards, accolades, and an enthusiastic fan base, winning three Emmy Awards for the PBS special “You Should Dream.” They have performed more than 1,000 concerts around the world, including a 24-city tour of the United Kingdom and China, and collaborations with the Cleveland Pops, Atlanta Symphony, and Houston Symphony, among others. They were recently named the #10 Classical Artist in the world according to *Billboard* magazine, and in 2018 will make their Canadian debut at the world-renowned Toronto Royal Conservatory of Music.
