Michael McCorry Rose, tenor

Michael McCorry Rose affirms that Black Lives Matter. He is an artistic producer, storyteller, change maker and Broadway actor who has been seen in the Tony Award winning musical *A Gentleman's Guide To Love and Murder*, starred as "Fiyero" in the smash hit musical *Wicked* and most recently appeared as "Tsar Nicholas II" in the new Broadway musical *Anastasia*.

In New York, Michael has appeared in concert at Jazz at Lincoln Center, Avery Fisher Hall, Symphony Space, Birdland and Feinstein's/54 Below. His theatrical credits include roles at regional theaters such as The Paper Mill Playhouse, Williamstown Theater Festival, Yale Repertory Theater, Primary Stages, Capital Repertory Theater and Project Shaw in New York City.

Michael has performed with symphonies and concert orchestras across the United States and recently starred in a symphonic concert of *Chess* with the Temecula Valley Symphony in California. Internationally, Michael has performed in concert at the Adelaide Music Festival in Australia, for the U.S. State Department in Nairobi, Kenya and in Sao Paulo, Brazil.

He regularly appears in concert with his partner Stephen Schwartz (*Wicked, Godspell, Pippin*). A recent concert of theirs was filmed for PBS's Great American Songbook Concert Series at NJPAC, aired in the summer of 2016 and was nominated for a 2017 Regional Emmy Award.

• The musical won Tony Awards for Best Musical, Best Actress, and Best Featured Actor, as well as an Oscar in 1956.







IRVING BERLIN "Cheek to Cheek"

- Written for the movie *Top Hat,* starring Fred Astaire & Ginger Rogers
- The song was nominated for an Oscar! ... but lost to "Lullaby of Broadway" in 1936



You can also find it in The English Patient, The Green Mile, and The Boss Baby



FREDERICK LOEWE **"On the Street Where You Live" from** *My Fair Lady*

- A love song in the midst of this musical about a young woman taking speech lessons to turn her into a proper lady of society.
- Julie Andrews starred in the original Broadway production!
- This song was spoofed for Sesame Street and turned into "On This Street Where I'm Grouchy"

GEORGE & IRA GERSHWIN "Someone to Watch Over Me"

• Written originally for the musical *Oh, Kay!,* it was at its inception an up-tempo song.



Singers have turned it into more of a ballad

over the years. Notable singers include Frank Sinatra, Ella Fitzgerald, Sarah Vaughan, Barbra Streisand, Elton John, and Amy Winehouse!

COLE PORTER "Begin the Beguine"

- Originally a dance tune that also became a vocal hit.
- Composed while Porter was on board a Pacific Cruise, near Indonesia and Fiji.

- The very first musical written by this partnership.
- Its original Broadway run shattered records and the film adaptation won an Oscar.




RODGERS & HAMMERSTEIN Rodgers & Hammerstein Medley

MATT GOULD AND CARSON KREITZER "Beauty/I Will Paint Her" from Lempicka

- A twenty-first century musical! Commissioned by Yale Rep and New Dramatists.
- It was premiered in July 2018 and was set to premiere on Broadway prior to the pandemic.



STEPHEN SCHWARTZ "Corner of the Sky" from Pippin

• The song is all about carving out one's own place in the world and is sung both at the very beginning of the musical, and reprised at the end.

LEONARD BERNSTEIN West Side Story Medley

• Vocal favorites from the groundbreaking musical, based on Shakespeare's *Romeo & Juliet*.

Includes:

"Black is the Color" (of My True Love's Hair) – a traditional folk ballad from Scotland



Has been recorded by:

Nina Simone, The Irish Descendants, Judy Collins, The King's Singers, Gregory Porter, and Lauryn Hill. It's been simultaneously adopted by the jazz and folk communities.

• Sung by Quasimodo, who is weighing a decision to leave his sanctuary of the cathedral and go out in public.

LERNER & LOEWE **"Almost Like Being in Love" from Brigadoon**

- The film version was sung by Gene Kelly in 1954.
- Other recordings by Nat King Cole (as heard in *Groundhog Day*) and Frank Sinatra
